Dear parishioners,

This Wednesday we mark Ash Wednesday – the formal start to Lent in which we place Ashes on out heads as an outward sign of our interior commitment to turn to God.

What is Lent?

First a foremost – a gift from God to each one of us. Lent lasts for 40 days. The number 40 often appears in the Scriptures meaning "an adequate amount". In this way the Church assures us that we have 'an adequate amount" of time to turn to God – no matter where we find ourselves in our faith - no matter if we feel near or far from God we have enough time during Lent to turn back to Him.

To help us in this turning towards God, we will host many different events within our parish. If you have never participated in one of these events, I encourage you to come and try it out – even if just once during this Lenten season. Please mark your calendars and see you there!

SPIRITUAL FORMATION

Join us for a Series on the Mass: A 3-week series over the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Sundays of Lent by Fr. Paul Patrick during the homily.

First Sunday of Lent – "Man shall not live by bread alone" - Mt 4:4 - Why did Jesus start the Mass? History and need of the Eucharist

Second Sunday of Lent - "Let us make 3 tents" Mt 17:4 -What actually happens at the Mass?

Third Sunday of Lent - The fig tree - cf Lk 13:1-9 -Why we don't check IDs at the door – The Mass is open for everyone - our relationship to the Eucharist.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS:

During Lent, the Stations of the Cross will take place on Tuesdays at 6:30 pm in English – Mass to follow, and on Fridays at 6:30 pm in Polish – Mass to follow.

Location & time: From 10:30 am - 12:00 pm in the This is an ancient prayer in the Church which gained popularity in the Medieval Church between the 12th and 15th basement of the parish office. century. It consists of a virtual pilgrimage of the Way of the Cross, or the path Jesus took during his Passion and Death. The Franciscans promoted it as a way in which Christians could meditate on the Passion of Christ without having to make the long and dangerous pilgrimage to the Holy Land to walk it in person. Today it is a staple of Catholic Lenten practice across the world. The prayer lasts about 25 min.

WEEKLY ADORATION

Every Friday During Lent following Mass at 12:00 pm until 6:15 pm.

In Adoration, the Consecrated Host is put out on display on the Altar and people gather in silence to pray and let God speak to them. The quote "Be still and know that I am God" cf psalm 46:10 reminds us of its main purpose – to simply sit - and let God speak to your heart in silence.

LENTEN LAMENTATIONS (GORZKIE ŻALE) Every Sunday morning during Lent at 9:00 am.

This prayer is a beautiful one which meditates in song the Passion of Christ. It was composed in 1707 by Fr. Wawrzyniec Benik in Warsaw. It has stood the test of time and remains a staple of Polish Lenten practice today. It lasts about 20 minutes.
